At its meeting on 20 January, 2017 the Canada Council's Killam Selection Committee chose the new Killam Research Fellows for 2017. We regret to inform you that, after careful consideration of your application, the Committee is unable to offer you a Killam Research Fellowship.

As you may know, this decision reflects consideration of both the intrinsic merit of your proposal and its relative standing in competition with all others. This year, the Committee considered 90 applications.
